HomeSpace and Inn from the Cold invite you to rethink community and support this essential downtown Calgary housing initiative. Conceived as a practical and creative partnership to directly address issues in our city, including lack of affordable housing options, depressed economic conditions, and the competition for funding between community organizations. Project Thrive is so much more than a typical fundraising campaign: it's a holistic approach to housing insecurity for families that need it the most, a call to action to reinvigorate the downtown core, and an investment in the city's future. It's emergency shelter, transitional housing, affordable housing and supports — all under one roof.







The Vision— Rethinking Community

HomeSpace and Inn from the Cold understand that our community becomes stronger with partnerships like this. Together, both organizations can accomplish so much more than each could hope to achieve on their own.

Demonstrating leadership and innovation, the two non-profit organizations have focused on housing insecurity and homelessness and have combined their areas of expertise for a first of its kind, made-in-Calgary solution: the conversion of a vacant downtown office space into shelter and affordable housing for more than 180 Calgarians in need.

Situated in a prime location with easy access to transit and essential amenities, Sierra Place at 706 7 Ave SW is a vacant downtown tower that's perfect for a retrofit, providing 82 units of affordable housing, as well as a childcare centre, family emergency shelter, and programming space.

Within 12 months (move-in dates are slated for late summer or fall 2022), the Sierra Place conversion will provide housing for vulnerable and homeless populations, including low-income families and individuals creating a tangible difference in the quality of life for residents and helping in moving families to independence.

The Financial Goal

Project Thrive is a unique \$30 million housing project that will amplify benefits to families, create 160 private sector jobs, and infuse vibrancy and economic stimulation in Calgary. By working together, **HomeSpace** and **Inn from the Cold** are able to move forward and advance their respective missions and visions for the future while creating efficiencies, ensuring their sustainability and assuring each organization's long-term financial security.

As a project partner, the City of Calgary sees this building renovation as an important first step to bolstering Calgary's struggling downtown core. It has pledged \$5.5 million to the project, situating the redevelopment of the Sierra Place family hub inside a larger commitment to reinvigorating Calgary's downtown.

Thanks to this important gift, **HomeSpace** and **Inn from the Cold** have secured over 75% of the project costs though Government partners and Corporate and Private donors. Together, we are launching a public fundraising campaign to bring Project Thrive forward to the community.

Dedicated to supporting families in the Calgary region, Inn from the Cold (IFTC) envisions a community where no child or family is homeless. To realize that vision IFTC provides three main programs: homeless prevention and diversion, emergency shelter, and housing. Trauma-informed and housingfirst principles guide the evolving delivery of each program, and we strive to adapt these programs to meet the unique needs of each family. In 2020 IFTC served a total of 1,611 family members, including 967 children, and housed 131 families.
